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## Freedom to Speak Up: Raising Concerns Policy

## Supporting you to speak out

If you have a genuine concern about practice or behaviour, unsafe clinical practice, a health and safety issue, financial impropriety, sexual harassment or any kind of unwanted behaviour, criminal action, or a cover-up of any of these things, you can:

- speak to your line manager, Union, Staff Governor, Customer Care, Health & Safety representative, a member of your Directorate Management Team, Freedom to Speak Up Guardian or Dignity at Work 'Ambassador'
- you can do this anonymously via the Customer Care Help Line on 0800 374208
- email: mediation@salisbury.nhs.uk or use the proforma on the Intranet.

If you feel that your concern has not been dealt with to your satisfaction, raise it at the next level, for example your line manager's line manager.

If you still feel that it has not been dealt with satisfactorily, discuss it with a senior manager or non-executive director of the Trust.

In exceptional circumstances, and if the matter cannot be discussed with any of the people above, contact a prescribed regulator (e.g. The Care Quality Commission, Health and Safety Executive, the Trust's auditor) or refer to a professional body (e.g. NMC, GMC, HPC).
